

UPCOMING DEADLINES

November 30 - Standard cover crop planting deadline

December 15 - ANY changes to cover crop planting MUST be reported

March 1 - Nutrients may be applied to cover crops

March 1 - Nutrient Management Plans
Due

March 15 - Cover Crop burn down begins -Harvestable cover crop may be harvested

May 1 - Bonus for cover crop not burned down

June 1 - Cover Crop MUST be burned down


